## PROHIBITING RENT BIDDING

Under the Residential Tenancies Act 1999

## A landlord may only offer a tenancy with rent set at a fixed amount

## A landlord cannot:

- require the tenant to pay; or
- accept from the tenant

a payment that is higher than the rent fixed at the time the tenancy was on offer

A landlord <u>can</u> ask the tenant to pay a higher amount of rent <u>only if</u> the landlord includes additional benefits or services that were not included in the initial offer.

Additional benefits might include offering gardening services, or exclusive use of a part of the premises not included in the initial offer

If a landlord withdraws the property from the market, the landlord <u>cannot</u> re-advertise it at a higher rent within one month of that withdrawal
